Participants are required to attend two training sessions and to engage fully with the leadership support throughout the year.

Rockwood seeks to convene a Fellowship class that is balanced with regard to gender, race, ethnicity, geography, and is committed to building partnership and collaboration. Our intention is to select a variety of leaders within national, state, regional, and community-based groups; academia; and media.
